As 2014 comes to a close, I'm reflecting on mounting evidence that improved access to domestic minerals makes for a healthier and more vibrant U.S. economy, including two reports released by the National Mining Association.


There is no question that "Made in the USA" is making a comeback; however, what remains in question is our ability to meet the growing demand of minerals necessary for production. A recent **survey** commissioned by NMA shows that while **80 percent** of U.S. manufacturing executives recognize the importance of sourcing minerals and metals from the United States, the majority are worried they will not have access to the minerals and metals they need when they need them

Moreover, SNL Metals & Mining's *U.S. Mines to Market* study emphasizes that the primary obstacle preventing the domestic mining industry from providing U.S. manufacturers with the minerals they need is the length of time it takes to obtain the permitting necessary to operate—a whopping seven to 10 years on average.

These studies' findings show that mining permitting reform is critical and we're asking

Congress to make it a priority for 2015. In September, the House passed the bipartisan National Strategic and Critical Minerals Production Act for the third year in a row, which would eliminate duplication and require better coordination between state and federal agencies — all without compromising rigorous environmental review.
