With the House and Senate in conference around the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA), now is the time to urge Congress to use this opportunity to strengthen the minerals supply chain that is so vital to U.S. military operations. The House-passed version of the NDAA includes a critical amendment championed by Rep. Mark Amodei (R-Nev.), which would provide our country with timely access to our wealth of domestic minerals.

As conference over the bill continues, it's vital our legislators support the passage of the minerals provision as a matter of national security. Each year, the Department of Defense uses 750,000 tons of minerals and metals to produce the technologies that protect our troops and our nation. Without minerals like silver, molybdenum and copper, key military hardware, like Apache helicopters, jet engines and body armor, wouldn't be possible.

Unfortunately, our antiquated and duplicative mine permitting process discourages domestic minerals production, decreasing supplies of critical minerals. This means our national defense has become increasingly reliant on foreign nations to supply these important raw materials. It's imperative that
