This Veterans Day we recognize the men and women who bravely serve our nation. The minerals mining industry is proud to support our military by providing the raw materials needed for the technologies that keep our troops safe and properly equipped. Access to our domestic resources is essential to ensuring our military has the equipment and tools it requires.

Beryllium, copper and other minerals are critical to the technologies our military relies on. However, due to outdated and duplicative policies, it can take anywhere from seven to 10 years to obtain a mine permit in the United States. This means the Department of Defense is reliant on foreign nations to obtain the minerals it needs for key military equipment.
